

The amazing Karmazinov triangle is named after the great Soviet mathematician Vladimir Aleksandrovich Karmazin. The triangle is the set of vectors perpendicular to the sides of a rhombus, with the diagonal acting as the radius. This was used by Karmazin to solve a problem about two-point lines in a rhombus. The triangle has three parts, one for each rhombus that can be formed. All these parts have the same volume, which can be obtained from the area of the original triangle, and from the area of the rhombus. The triangle has a sharp corner at the rhombus, and a very gentle corner along the radius. For the gradient of a function at a point, the sharpness of the corner is the second derivative of the function, and the gradient along the radius is one half the derivative of the function.
